Welcome to the latest Canterbury Area Volunteer Programme.
We run tasks every Thursday across the eastern half of the
Stour Valley, from Chartham to Sandwich.

Date	Location and Details
Oct 4 th	Denstroude Pond - clearing pond vegetation, including invasive <i>Crassula</i>
Oct 11 th	Hambrook Marshes, Canterbury - various jobs, including maintaining ditches and scrapes
Oct 18 th	Wade Marsh - our final visit of the year to Thanet to clear invasive Parrot's Feather from drainage channels
Oct 25 th	Whitehall Meadows, Canterbury - clearing ditches of vegetation to create a varied habitat for birds, insects and mammals
Nov 1 st	North Downs Way, Chartham Hatch - continuing with our work to improve drainage along the National Trail
Nov 8 th	Willow Wood, Upper Harbledown - coppicing along a public right of way to improve the footpath surface
Nov 15 th	Blean Wood NNR - Hand-coppicing along a woodland ride to allow woodland plants to flourish
Nov 22 nd	Hambrook Marshes, Canterbury - hand coppicing on the old railway embankment to enhance the area for reptiles
Nov 29 th	Hambrook Marshes - a second week of coppicing on the embankment
Dec 6 th	No Mans Orchard, Chartham Hatch - Clearing bramble from around the apple trees
Dec 13 th	Christmas Task - location to be confirmed

Volunteer Information

Pick up details

Please be at North Lane car park in Canterbury for 9.45am on the day of the task where you will get a lift to the site in the KSCP minibus or landrover - no need to telephone or book a place (unless stated). You can expect to be dropped off again by 4.45pm, although this may vary slightly. If you would like to make your own way to the work site, please ring to confirm details and get directions.

What to bring

Make sure you bring a packed lunch and a drink. Some refreshments are provided on the day. It is advisable to wear strong footwear, especially steel toe capped boots if you have any, work gloves and waterproofs just in case. In the summer it may also be a good idea to bring a sun hat and sun cream. In winter be sure to wear plenty of warm clothes.

Health and Safety

As mentioned above, in summer guard yourself against the sun and bring plenty of cold drinks - dehydration is a serious consideration at this time of year. There will always be at least one First Aider on the work task. Safe and responsible use of tools is emphasised by the group leader. If you have any particular medical conditions, or are on medication, please let the group leader know at an appropriate moment. Volunteers should also ensure that their tetanus immunisation is up to date.

Under 16s

Under 16s are permitted on task if accompanied by a guardian, or on a school placement, and only then if they do not pose any risk to themselves or other members of the group through irresponsible use of tools.
